65TH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 65th anniversary of the ends of WW II. The D-Day landings by a combined force of British, American, Canadian and French forces began both the largest sea-borne invasion ever launched and the end of the war in Europe.

The surrender of the German forces in northwestern Europe was signed on May 4. A second document, covering all the German forces, was signed with more ceremony, at the headquarters of the commanding general of the victorious forces in Europe, Dwight Eisenhower, at Reims, in the presence of Soviet as well as United States, British, and French delegations. At midnight on 8 May 1945, the war in Europe was officially over.

This year also marks the 65th anniversary of the liberation of the Netherlands. The Dutch call the Canadian Veterans heroes not just for what they did on the battlefields but because they put their lives on hold to help liberate Holland.

Every year, the Dutch honour the fallen Canadians by placing flowers on each grave. On Christmas Eve, there is a candlelight ceremony at the Holten Canadian War Cemetery, where local schoolchildren place a special candle that burns for 24 hours on every grave.
